
Hi Mark,

Just as an after thought, do you (the council) have any contractors who might like to quote?

Dear Nigel,

Many thanks for inviting us to quote your pergola project at the New Milton Petanque Club.

We are providing you with 2 quotes.

The first being for a covered shelter spanning 3.6 metres in length by 2.4 metres in depth. It will stand at approximately 2.4 to 3 metres high (to allow water to run off from the clear pvc corrugated roofing).

We will remove the current shelter and repurpose the storage by building it into the new structure. We will take this away to the local recycling centre as part of the price. (We are licensed waste carriers.

All of the timber we use is high quality pressure treated soft wood. We will also use eaves fillers and washer and screw caps to prevent any leaks.

The second part of the quote is for extending the shelter by approximately 5.7 metres in length to cover the bench. This will also be 2.4 metres in depth and 2.4 to 3 metres in height to match the first shelter. It will be constructed exactly the same, so if necessary this could be retro fitted.

We have attached a couple of pictures for you to see our previous work on similar structures and a small sketch to give you an idea of the measurements we are working to.

These prices include vat and all workmanship is guaranteed for 2 years. If you would like to take a look at our previous work and reviews please feel free to check out our website.

## DEFIBRILLATOR FOR LONG MEADOW

The easiest way to install this is to tap in to the FDC fuse board (either from the Friendly Dog Club or Sea Scouts building). From whichever, cable above ground in conduit then excavate east below ground minimum 450mm deep in the meadow towards the car park (very roughly shown in red below). We would use a 2.5mm<sup>2</sup> SWA cable which will be more than sufficient and safe.

When it comes to mounting the cabinet, 2 x 100mm timber mounting posts are suggested with a 25mm thick external ply backboard to mount the cabinet on, and a small canopy above for added protection (Note: we are also investigating to see if there is an alternative in non-timber which would be sympathetic with the location).

The supply cable would be terminated in a waterproof & tamperproof box with a fused spur alongside to take the cabinet cable (these would be mounted to the backboard). All electrical works would fully comply with the 18<sup>th</sup> edition of IET regulations BS7671.



Current costs for iPad SP1 defibrillator and Defibsafe 2 external cabinet (both shown below) are approx. £1,400 ex VAT. This cabinet has a trickle heat element to provide small element heating to protect the defib itself. It is also LED illuminated to as a visual aid in hours of darkness.



**The cost to provide the infrastructure would be around £900 plus VAT.**

There is an external insulated cabinet available that requires no electricity and are similar in price to the Defibsafe 2 cabinet. The drawback is – no illumination and no background heat which could lead to much earlier deterioration of the battery and moisture build up on the defib case itself.
